## Who is eligible?

Patients with insurance plans or employers participating in an alternate funding program (also sometimes referred to as patient advocacy programs, or specialty networks) requiring the patient to apply to a manufacturer's patient assistance program are not eligible for Amgen Safety Net Foundation.

- ✓ Patients who have lived in the U.S. or its territories for more than 6 months
- ✓ Patients who demonstrate a financial need based on the federal poverty limit (FPL). This may vary by product. Please visit our Eligibility page on our website for detailed guidance.  
FPL amounts subject to change. Amounts for Alaska and Hawaii may vary from other states and are usually slightly higher.
- ✓ Those who are uninsured
- ✓ Certain Medicare Part D patients with product coverage who cannot afford their out of pocket costs

### These patients must:

- › Demonstrate their inability to afford the medicine
- › Not be eligible for Medicaid or Medicare's low-income subsidy (Extra Help)
- › Satisfy all payer guidelines and Prior Authorization (PA) requirements prior to applying for assistance
- › Not have any other financial support options including independent co-pay patient assistance programs (ICPAP)
